Rectors Ramblings

Dear Friends:

All Saints Parish is embarking on a redevelopment PROCESS. PROCESS is the operative word here. The Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) approved by both the Parish Council and Vestry is but a first step in a process that has dozens of stages to it. Patience and Prayer is key to thriving in any process. Some of our process will be in our control; several stages will not be in our control. We have only just begun the process and it will be a year or two before any shovels go into the ground. During the process many



"conversations" will be had (Just to remind you, a "conversation" is unofficial talk which opens up possibilities and opportunities). Many things will be explored and changed when conversation is engaged in. We have to be open and patient with the process. The work of the Parish Council in the process will be to narrow down the possibilities and make decisions about what we as a Parish will officially pursue. I would encourage everyone to come to Parish Council meetings since this is where information will be shared and decisions made by members of Parish Council. The role of Vestry will be to vote on what Parish Council has decided, and to recommend any changes they may want. Patience and Prayer is key to thriving in any process. I ask you to stay engaged with the process even though it may be annoying at times. All we do is to be for the glory of God, and I believe this redevelopment process, as an act of Truth and Reconciliation, is where God is leading us.

The Bible teaches us about the power of gratitude. An attitude of thanksgiving to God will consistently fill us with peace, joy and fulfillment. The apostle Paul is well known for writing Scriptures about being thankful. Some of the most well-known and often quoted passages are focused on gratitude, including but not limited to giving thanks for all things, in all circumstances (Ephesians 5:20; 1 Thessalonians 5:18), being thankful even in suffering (Romans 5:3-5; James 1:1-4), and to do everything in the name of Jesus out of a spirit of gratefulness (Colossians 3:17).



That being said, if being grateful is one of the most important aspects for peace, joy and fulfillment why is it so difficult for some of us to be grateful? Perhaps, it's because of regret and anxiety.

I've learned that no amount of regret changes the past and no amount of anxiety changes the future. But any amount of gratitude changes the present. Hence the reason we are commanded to be thankful in "all" circumstances.

I've also found that gratitude on the deepest level is a reflection, acknowledgment, and acceptance of our worth – to God and other people. When we choose gratitude over regret and anxiety, we accept ourselves as worthy and give ourselves permission to be loved by God and to share love with others.

It encourages us 'all' to shift our perspectives to one of deep gratitude, awareness and acceptance of our value to God and other people. It is only at this deepest level that gratitude can lift us from depression, restore relationships, and bridge peace, joy, and fulfillment. ~ with permission Lowell Twin Pinnock

\$\$\$ SERMON ON THE AMOUNT \$\$\$



The financial picture since the last Sermon on the Amount has not improved. As enjoyable and successful as the fundraisers have been, they

did not bring in enough to cover our rising building and utility expenses. Except for an occasional needed repair our monthly payments are for payroll, utilities, and Diocesan Assessment. Except for \$25.00 to keep the account open we have now drawn on all the money held in our Savings Account. After an extensive discussion your Parish Council came to the difficult decision to send a letter to the Trustees of the Christine Morrison Fund asking for \$27,000.00 to help tide us over. If approved this money will be deposited at the Diocese for them to draw on for the next three months for the Rector's wages, which is what Christine Morrison requested it be used for in her will. This will not last long and we may have to ask the trustees for more help.

Two events have happened to create the position we now find ourselves in. In quick order, three of our most generous donors died and then the cost of living skyrocketed, leaving us with some very hard decisions to make. We could ask the Diocese for financial help but they would look at our finances and point out that the Christine Morrison Fund has \$161,078.44 sitting in the Consolidated Investments and we need to use that before they will consider any other help.

I am giving you a more detailed break-down of our income and expenses so that you can have a better understanding of what your Parish Council has been facing. We are getting more Hall use requests, the Walkathon is coming up, and hopefully Thanksgiving donations will be as good as Easter was.

ABOUT PAD

What is the Pre-Authorized Donation Program?

The Anglican Diocese of New Westminster has established a Pre-Authorized Donation Program (PAD), using either automatic debit or credit card, to assist you in supporting your own parish ministry.

WHY SHOULD I PARTICIPATE?

Advantages for the donor:

- Convenience. Your offering is received automatically every month;
- Continual support of your home church when you are away;
- Continual support of ministries and programs:
- Changes may be made with written notification.

dvantages for the parish:

- Regular, dependable flow of contributions to the parish;
- Reduction of paperwork and bookkeeping;
 and
- · Reduction of bank overdrafts.

PAD creates a win/win situation for you and your parish. It is a very simple procedure:

When you participate in PAD, your bank or credit card account will be debited automatically on or about the 15th of the month. This amount will be credited to the parish's account.

HOW DO I ENROLL?

If your parish has decided to participate, this is how you make your gift through PAD:

- Decide the amount of your donation to your parish to be debited from your account each month;
- Fill out the form in this brochure.
 For credit card transactions fill out the credit card information, or, if using automatic debit attach a cheque from your account marked 'yoid': and
- Put the form in an envelope for the offering plate (include a voided cheque if using automatic debit).

WHO LOOKS AFTER THE PROGRAM?

The Finance Department of the Diocese of New Westminster manages the PAD program for local parishes.

There is no minimum number of givers required for a parish to initiate the program. However, the more contributors participating in the program the more valuable and viable it is for the church.

WHAT IF I WANT TO PLACE SOMETHING IN THE OFFERING PLATE?

Small cards indicating you have given through the Pre-authorized Donation Program will be made available at your parish to place in the offering plate. Please note that your local parish church will issue receipts for gifts.

PAD MAY BE A WONDEFUL WAY FOR YOU TO HELP THE CHURCH :)

The work of the church in the Diocese of New Westminster is made possible through the generosity of its members. You can, through PAD, help the church do its work.

National Truth and Reconciliation Sunday/Orange Shirt Day

10:00 am October 1, 2023 All Saints Anglican and St. Andrew's United Churches 2nd and James, Mission

We will be remembering the countless Indigenous children who never came home from Canada's Indian Residential Schools and will also honour the survivors who did, their families and communities.

The National Day for Truth and Reconciliation and Orange Shirt Day occur together. Orange Shirt Day is an Indigenous-led grassroots commemorative day intended to raise awareness of the individual, family and community inter-generational impacts of residential schools, and to promote the concept of "Every Child Matters". The orange shirt is a symbol of the stripping away of culture, freedom and self-esteem experienced by Indigenous children over generations. As a way to acknowledge our nation's need for reconciliation with Indigenous peoples, we encourage you to wear orange. Drummers are also very welcome.

Our speaker will be Janice Silver, CEO of Mamele'Awt Queesome Housing Society, who will speak about her many years of experience developing low and middle income housing in the Fraser Valley. There will also be a special collection for All Saints' Truth and Reconciliation Scholarship Fund for Indigenous students graduating from Ećole Mission Secondary School.

2023 T-Shirt Design

We are pleased to announce our 2023 Every Child Matters t-shirt design!!! A big heartfelt congratulations to our contest winner, Charliss Santos, for her vision of "Every Child Matters". Charliss is a grade 10 student at St. Augustine School in Ponoka, Alberta, Canada, and her design showcases an Indigenous child encompassed in two hands and surrounded by people, a heart, and an eagle. The child's silhouette represents all the Indigenous children who suffered or were impacted by the Indian Residential schools. The people surrounding the child represent the strong communities of the Indigenous people and the way they support each other. The heart represents healing and forgiveness, and the eagle symbolizes acceptance, honesty, and freedom.



I live in a semi-rural area. We recently had a new neighbour call the local city council office to request the removal of the DEER CROSSING sign on our road.


The reason: 'Too many deers are being hit by cars out here! I don't think this is a good place for them to be crossing anymore.'
